Voices of September 11th

Voices of September 11th (VOICES) was co-founded by 9/11 family members Mary Fetchet and Beverly Eckert in 2001 to provide information and support services to all those impacted by the September 11th terrorist attacks. VOICES provides a wide range of programs that promote resiliency; commemorates the lives lost; advocates for reforms to make our country safer and share lessons learned to assist others responding to traumatic events. VOICES services include teleconference support groups, case management services, and an annual September 10th Information Forum and September 11th Commemorative Luncheon. With offices in CT, NJ and Washington, D.C., serving over 14,000 registered members living in the US and abroad. In 2011, VOICES participated in 14 commemorative events in five states and in Nova Scotia, Canada.

9/11 Living Memorial Project

In 2006, VOICES launched the 9/11 Living Memorial Project, originally conceived by Monica Iken and September's Mission, to commemorate the nearly 3,000 lives lost and to document the firsthand accounts of rescue workers and survivors. The archive includes a site for each of the 2,977 victims and hundreds of memorials and foundations that demonstrate the caring, courage and compassion the world experienced that day.

VOICES professional staff has met one-on-one with over 1,600 family members throughout the tri-state area, in Washington, D.C., Pennsylvania and Massachusetts. Today, the 9/11 Living Memorial includes an extensive collection of over 60,000 photographs, written materials and personal keepsakes that has been transferred to the 9/11 Memorial & Museum in NYC for use in their exhibits.

Building Bridges Awards

Beginning in 2004, VOICES has recognized individuals who have made significant contributions to the 9/11 community through the Building Bridges awards. The plaque includes a painting drawn by 13 year old Bethany Roddy of Tacoma, Washington. Above the bridge is a heart with the inscription, "Every day we are given stones. But what do we build? Is it a bridge or a wall?"
