Princeton Committee on Foreign Relations Hosts "How 9/11 Launched H.E.A.R.T. 9/11"

The Princeton Committee on Foreign Relations (PCFR) and its president, Duane Morris attorney William Weiner, will host "**How 9/11 Launched H.E.A.R.T. 9/11: the Story of an International Relief Organization, Aiding Victims, Survivors and Others Throughout the World,**" at 6 p.m. on March 22, 2011 at The Nassau Club, 6 Mercer St., Princeton, NJ.

The program features Healing Emergency Aid Response Team (H.E.A.R.T. 9/11) founder William Keegan, a highly-decorated lieutenant in the Special Operations Division and a veteran of The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey Police Department, (PAPD).

"We hear the word hero so often that it can sometimes seem overused," said William Weiner, PCFR president and attorney with Duane Morris LLP, "but Bill Keegan is a true hero, not only for his rescue work in the wake of September 11, 2001, but for his continued dedication to help victims of all types of disasters throughout the world. We are very pleased that he is able to join us and share the story of H.E.A.R.T. 9/11."

H.E.A.R.T. 9/11, founded by Keegan in 2007, is a non-profit, non-sectarian organization comprised of veteran police officers, fire fighters, construction trade union workers and surviving families of those killed on September 11, 2001. Its mission is to deliver relief help, on a volunteer basis, worldwide, wherever a disaster response is required to a community crisis.
