About Voices of September 11th

Voices of September 11th (VOICES) was co-founded by 9/11 family members Mary Fetchet and Beverly Eckert following the attacks on September 11th. Led by Ms. Fetchet, a clinical social worker who lost her 24 year old son Brad, VOICES provides support services that promote resiliency and address the long-term needs of 9/11 families, rescue workers and survivors. VOICES services include support groups, case management, workshops, special events and annual September 10th Day of Remembrance events in New York City. VOICES supported the creation of the 9/11 Commission and their reforms, with a focus on promoting national preparedness.

VOICES has over 11,000 members living in the United States and abroad and offices in New Canaan, CT and New Brunswick, NJ.

About the 9/11 Living Memorial Project

In 2006 **VOICES** launched the **9/11 Living Memorial Project** to commemorate the nearly 3,000 lives lost and document the first hand accounts of rescue workers and survivors at the World Trade Center, the Pentagon and Shanksville, PA. VOICES' staff has hosted over 300 workshops in communities around the country and met with over 800 families to create a meaningful tribute to their loved ones and to document their stories.

The Living Memorial, currently online at www.voicesofsept11.org, contains an extensive collection of over 40,000 photographs, written materials and personal keepsakes donated by the families. The 9/11 Living Memorial will be a core component of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at Ground Zero.

The Always Remember 9/11 Exhibit is a collection of VOICES artwork, quilts, 9/11 mementos and photographs from the 9/11 Living Memorial Project.
