The 2-day training provides a victim-centered approach with practical tools and lessons learned that prepare community stakeholders including law enforcement, fire personnel, emergency managers, and non-profit organizations. The 2023 curriculum includes 17 modules and step-by-step guidelines that address the immediate, short and long-term support necessary for those impacted and the community at large, such as:

- The Human Side of Incidents Response and Recovery
- Building Resilience in Individuals and Families
- Understanding Human Responses to Trauma
- Planning for the Aftermath
- Planning for Long-term Recovery

VOICES Programs offer a wide range of support services including individual consultation, referrals, and clinical and peer-to-peer support groups. Monthly virtual workshops are facilitated by experts on topics including grief and loss, trauma, anxiety, depression, PTSD and wellness programs to build resilience. VOICES has provided over 202,000 hours of social service support.

Voices Annual Remembrance Symposium on September 9 and 10 in New York City, provides information for the 9/11 community and those impacted by and responding to other tragedies. The two-day event features experts in mental health, litigation, law enforcement and national security, in the US and abroad. The 2022 Symposium reached 1,300+ individuals from 28 states & 16 countries.

VOICES 9/11 Living Memorial, launched in 2006, is an online collection of over 87,000 photographs commemorating the 2,977 lives lost on that tragic day. The Living Memorial is expanding to honor the lives of the 6,300+ responders and survivors who have died since of 9/11-related illnesses. VOICES is helping families create lasting tributes in honor of their loved ones.
