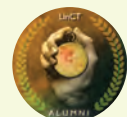

VOICES has embarked on two initiatives that build upon its longstanding, victim-centered approach and commitment to share over two decades of lessons learned.



VOICES Community Preparedness Training is built upon 22 years of experience. The 2-day training provides a victim-centered approach with practical tools and lessons learned that prepare community stakeholders including law enforcement, fire personnel, emergency managers, and non-profit organizations.

The 2023 curriculum includes 17 modules and step-by-step guidelines that address the immediate, short and long-term support necessary for those impacted and the community at large, such as:

- The Human Side of Incidents Response and Recovery
- Building Resilience in Individuals and Families
- Understanding Human Responses to Trauma
- Planning for the Aftermath
- Planning for Long-term Recovery



VOICES 9/11 Living Memorial, launched in 2006, is an online collection of over 87,000 photographs commemorating the 2,977 lives lost on that tragic day.
