VOICES completed a research project entitled, "Investigating the Long-Term Impact of Bereavement due to Terrorism: Factors that Contribute to Trauma, Grief, Growth and Resilience." The project was conducted in partnership with the Center for the Study of Traumatic Stress at the Uniformed Services University and the Canadian Resource Centre for Victims of Crime.

Completed with support from a grant by Public Safety Canada's Kanishka Project Contribution Program, the research project involves all family members of the individuals lost at the World Trade Center, the Pentagon and in Shanksville, PA on 09/11 as well as the family members of the 329 individuals lost in the 1985 bombing of Air India Flight 182 that crashed off the coast of Ireland – the majority of whom were Canadian. The study will identify the long-term needs of individuals impacted by terrorism.

18th Anniversary Resiliency Symposium September 9, New York City

VOICES Resiliency Symposium, Knowledge to Practice: Pathways to Long-Term Healing – A Victim-Centered Approach, brought together leading researchers, mental health practitioners and government agencies providing support services for victims' families, survivors and responders, in the United States and abroad. The event provided a unique opportunity to bridge the gap between research and practice, as well as to learn from individuals who have been directly affected by acts of terrorism and mass violence.

This year, we heard very moving testimonies from survivors, responders, and parents and spouses who lost loved ones in the shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida, as well as the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. The daylong event also included presentations by accomplished subject matter experts in the areas of vicarious trauma; disaster mental health; and supporting victims of mass tragedy.



Survivors and Responders Suffering from 9/11-Related Illnesses

VOICES assists survivors and responders in accessing treatment for life-threatening illnesses and serious medical conditions due to their exposure to toxins in Lower Manhattan in the aftermath of the September 11 attacks.

Since the passage of the James Zadroga 9/11 Health and Compensation Act in 2010, VOICES has supported 9/11 survivors and responders through our work with the Centers for Disease Control. Working in collaboration with our outreach partners, we assist survivors and responders in the process of enrolling for medical and mental health treatment at the World Trade Center Health Program Centers of Excellence.

In February, VOICES staff joined John Feal, comedian Jon Stewart, Joe Zadroga, father of James Zadroga, and hundreds of World Trade Center responders and survivors in Washington, DC to urge Congress to permanently authorize the Victim Compensation Fund (VCF). The VCF provides financial support for 9/11 responders and survivors who are suffering from life-threatening illnesses, and for the families of those who have died from 9/11-related illnesses. On July 29, 2019, H.R. 1327 Never Forget the Heroes: James Zadroga, Ray Pfeifer, and Luis Alvarez Permanent Authorization of the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund Act was signed into law.

Today, over 40,000 have been diagnosed with life-threatening illnesses, including most cancers and serious mental health conditions including PTSD. VOICES has provided over 1,400 survivors and responders with support services and relevant information through annual conferences and workshops.

The Tip Sheets focus on promoting healing and community resilience in the aftermath of mass violence and provide specific, timely short and long-term guidance for multiple groups.
